On March 16, we received a revised protocol from the Office of the Bishop of the Diocese of Savannah regarding Masses. Effective Tuesday, March 17, 2020, there are to be **no public** Masses celebrated in any parish churches or missions in the Diocese of Savannah. Our church and chapel are available to all who wish to use it for private prayer and personal devoltions.

The Diocese will continue to monitor COVID-19 and will review the protocol on April 1 to determine whether Palm Sunday and Holy Week services will be open to the public.

We wanted to let you know what this directive means for St. William. The Diocese has asked all parishes and missions to:

Live stream Masses.

We do have a camera live streaming in the church. The audio is not working at the present time. We are trying our best to get it working as soon as possible. Go to the live camera at the bottom of the front page of our website, stwill.net.

The Cathedral of St. John the Baptist is Savannah will have live stream Mass on Sundays at 10am. Follow the link to the Diocese website https://diosav.org/ livestream.

EWTN also airs Mass on television, check your local listings for times. Their website lists Masses at 12am, 8am 12pm and 7pm.. ewtn.com/tv/schedule.

Keep our churches and missions open, if possible, for private prayer and personal devotions.

The church and chapel will be open for private prayer and personal devotion, Mon-Thurs, 9am - 4pm, and Friday, 9am - 1pm. The church is limited to 10 parishioners at a time and if necessary, a waiting line will form and one may enter when one leaves. We ask you to keep a distance of 6 feet between you and others.

Adoration will continue from 9am – 4pm on Tuesdays in the church

STEWARDSHIP MOMENT 4th Sunday in Lent - March 22, 2020



Today's readings are filled with contrasting images - God's vision versus human vision, spiritual blindness versus spiritual sightedness. Embracing a stewardship way of life can free us from spiritual blindness and help us to reflect the light of Christ's love in our daily lives.

> Our Second Reading, from Ephesians begins, "...You were once in darkness but now you are light in the Lord.

Live as children of light." Because of our Baptism, we have the "light" of the Blessed Trinity dwelling within us. In the difficulties and messiness of daily life, it's easy to forget this glorious truth about ourselves. It can also be difficult to determine whether we truly are living in a way that reflects Christ's light.

The stewardship way of life, with its emphasis on the rightly ordered use of the gifts of time, talents and treasure, gives us a guide to help ensure we really are living as "children of the light."

In our Gospel passage from John, Christ restores sight to a man born blind. The man says that Christ "opened my eyes." These Lenten days are an excellent time for us to ask Jesus to open our eyes, too. Let us ask Him to show us where we may be suffering from spiritual blindness, perhaps even in subtle ways in our use — or misuse — of time, talents and treasure.

As we continue on our Lenten journey, let's intensify our efforts in any of these areas where we have become a little blinded so that by Easter, we are truly living as children of the liaht.
