


Continuing:

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STEWARDSHIP MOMENT SECOND SUNDAY - APRIL 19, 2020



The Christian steward approaches life with an "Easter vision" rooted in gratitude for the salvation our Lord has won for us through His death and Resurrection. Today's readings on this Divine Mercy Sunday teach us how this approach plays out in daily life and remind us that we can have complete trust in the mercy of God to lead us, step-by-step, to heaven.

Certainly, it is challenging to live for heaven when the things of the earth — job stress, family crisis, health troubles, political strife — loom large on the horizon. We can find ourselves becoming cynical like the Apostle, Thomas, in our Gospel passage today — until he had an encounter with the merciful Savior. We all recall the famous line from Thomas, who was not present with the other Apostles during Jesus' first appearance after the Resurrection. Beaten down by the events of the last several days, Thomas refuses to believe that the others had indeed "seen the Lord" as they claimed.

Thomas stubbornly declares he would not believe their story about the Lord unless he placed his finger into the nailmarks and his hand into His side. Yet, these doubts did not repel our Lord. Our merciful Lord saw that beneath the hubris in Thomas' statement were pain and disappointment. Our Lord is mercy itself. And so He did not condemn Thomas, but calmed his doubts and fears, and allowed Thomas to actually touch those Sacred Wounds. What amazing grace.

When we are tempted to give in to doubts to the faith for whatever the reason, all we need to do is seek the Lord — in prayer, in the sacraments, through the encouragement of our Christian communities — and just as He did for Thomas, our Lord will mercifully restore our Easter vision and fill us with His joy and peace.

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APRIL IS CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH PROMISE To Protect Pledge To HEAL

We are all part of a larger culture of protection and healing within the Church. As members of this culture, we value the prevention of abuse and the support of those who have been abused. Each one of us can play an important role in strengthening this culture. For example, we can better prevent abuse by ensuring that the signs of abuse are identified and reported. Noticing these warning signs, taking them seriously, and reporting them could prevent abuse in the future. Even when we witness inappropriate behavior or something that just doesn't seem quite right, we must report our concerns through the appropriate channels. The USCCB has offered these <u>Ten Tips for Protecting Children and Offering Outreach to Victims/Survivors</u>.

Abuse Hotline Number: To report abuse of a minor by a Diocese of Savannah employee or volunteer, call the abuse hotline number at 888-357-5330 or the Office for the Protection of Children and Young People, 912-201-4074. The diocesan policy on sexual abuse of minors, is available at www.diosav.org/childyouthprotection.

The Diocese of Savannah is committed to providing safe environments and fostering continuous improvement



in every organization that sponsors activities and/or provides services to children and youth. Listed below are the minimum requirements that must be met by any adult (age 18 or over) who works/volunteers in a Diocese of Savannah Church, School or Social Service Agency AND comes into contact with any youth (under age 18) during the course of their ministry.

- Attendance at the VIRTUS "Protecting God's Children for Adults (PGCA)" Training
- Registration of the above training on the website <u>www.virtusonline.org</u>. Registration is preferred prior to the class but can be completed after the class.
- A National Criminal Background check, a check of the Sex Offender's Registry, and (preferred) a verification of the Social Security Number at least once every five years
- Read the Diocesan "Code of Conduct" and agree to its terms by signing the back page and turning it into your church or school
- Completing the "Safe Environment Refresher Training" on the VIRTUS website if it has been five years or more since attending the PGCA class.

WHAT WE ARE DOING

What's being done in our own diocese to help victims/survivors of abuse, and protect children, youth and the vulnerable?

- We report all allegations of abuse directly to law enforcement and cooperate with civil authorities on all investigations.
- Our diocese has a designated Victim Assistance Coordinator whose primary role is to accompany survivors and provide resources for their healing journey.
- We also have an independent review board, consisting primarily of lay members. The role of the review board is to review allegations and make a recommendation to the bishop regarding the suitability for ministry.
- We train adults on how to maintain a safe environment by using the VIRTUS training program.
- We train minors in parish religious education programs and in Catholic schools to identify warning signs of abuse and inappropriate behavior, as well as how to report abuse.
- By following all of our diocesan policies and procedures to create safe environments, we can maintain a culture of protection and healing.

VIRTUS will soon be doing its annual audit, to make sure everyone serving in a ministry is current with a background check and SERT. This includes Ushers, Lectors, Eucharist Minsters etc.)

So, while everyone has time, please log onto your Virtus.org account and make sure your background check, and SERT (Safe Environment Refresher training) are up to date.

My dear friends,

Peace and all good things to you!

During Holy Week, we celebrated Palm Sunday and the commemoration of Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem. It seemed so strange to re-enact this event in an empty cathedral as we enter into the holicst wook of the year. Something very essential was missing. It was YOU. It just did not seem right. During the reading of the Passion Narrative, there was no "crowd". It was a Palm Sunday, the likes of which I had never experienced before. The Chrism Mass, the Celebration of the Lord's Supper, Friday of the Passion of the Lord, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday will be strangely memorable because of the absence of the People of God. Please know how much your priests and I miss you. We are grateful for social media and the ability to live-stream all of our liturgical events during Holy Week. But it was not the same without you.

If you and your family need help, please let us know. This is a time when we need to check on each other.

A month from today, I will be installed as the seventh Archbishop of Attanta. It will be sad for me to leave the Diocese of Savannah. I will have the opportunity to share my thoughts with my priests, deacons and consecrated religious during the Chrism Mass via the live-stream from the Cathedral as we renew our priosity promises and bless the Holy Oils used for the sacramental life of the Church.

There will always be a special place in my heart for you and for the people of the Diocese of Savannah. This is where I was ordained a bishop and where I served for the first eight years as the Shepherd of this local church. I will never forget you. I will never forget your warm welcome, your kind words, your thoughtful gestures and your loving prayers. Thank you for your praise and for your forgiveness. I have a heart full of fond memories that will always make me smile and be grateful to God for many unique experiences that I will forever cherish. Please accept this Friar's sincere gratitude for all that remains in my heart that will always remind me of you.

I humbly ask for your prayers and I promise you mine.
