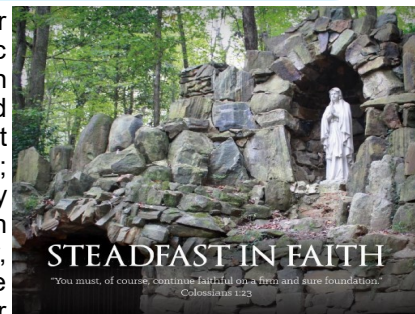

St. Blaise is given special recognition not only with a feast day on February 3, but with a unique ceremony that parallels the practice of anointing the sick. In this case, it is blessing the throats of those with throat disorders and anyone who wishes to avoid getting such a malady or something related to the throat, even the words one speaks. Ordinarily two candles are blessed, held slightly open, and pressed against the throat as the blessing is said.

This year, the **BLESSING OF THE THROATS** will be offered at all Sunday Masses this weekend, January 30 & 31, 2021, and on the feast day of St. Blaise, February 3. The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments has directed universally that due to the risk posed this year by the COVID 19 virus, blessings of throats will be done generally at the end of Mass, but no individual blessings will be administered due to the close contact that would be required. Therefore, at the end of all weekend Masses, on January 30 & 31, and at the end of the feast day 8:15am Mass on February 3, a general proclamation of the proper prayer and blessing will be extended to the entire congregation.

St. Blaise's protection of those with throat troubles comes from a legend that a boy was brought to him who had a fish bone stuck in his throat. The boy was about to die when St. Blaise healed him.

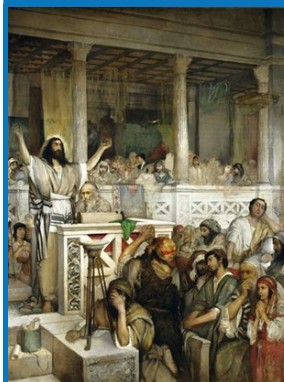

STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JANUARY 31



Our readings today remind us of God's authority.

As we reflect on our Gospel, we recognize that God possesses all authority and that we want to give Him all authority. Jesus was teaching in the synagogue on the sabbath. All were fixed on His words and astonished at what He had to say. Suddenly everyone's attention shifted to a man with an unclean spirit who began to question Jesus and His authority. Jesus responded, "Quiet, come out of him!" and removed the evil spirit from the man. All were amazed at the healing of this man.

Life can sometimes look like the synagogue in Capernaum. We are living as disciples of Christ when we suddenly recognize evil around us — through events in our lives, temptations we are enduring, or by falling into sin. It can distract us, consume our attention, or even cause us to despair. In these moments of trial, we must remember the Healer in our Gospel today. Recall His words, "Quiet, come out of Him!" Jesus has the power and authority over evil, for He has conquered sin and death. He also has the power and authority over us. And when we invite Him to have that authority, He will heal us and help us persevere.

Today, we are reminded that God is in control and that we want Him to be in control. He is the loving Healer that will work miracles in our lives if we give Him the authority to do so.


