STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

25TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - SEPTEMBER 22. 2024

Our readings today bring to light the daily struggle between good and evil and how we can combat this struggle In our Gospel, we see an example of how surthrough gratitude. rendering to our passions negatively affects us. Jesus was with His disciples when they began to argue amongst themselves as to who was the greatest in the group.

If we look at our own lives, we might find many instances where we fall into the same tendencies — we constantly compare ourselves to others, out of pride we feel the need to point out another's faults or choose to fight back in an argument. We know we should act one way but choose another.

When Jesus hears what the apostles are discussing, He has them focus on a child. "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me." If we reflect on the moment someone receives a child, oftentimes their hearts are overwhelmed with joy and gratitude for this gift. There is no jealousy or anger, just thanksgiving, and appreciation. The apostles are busy bickering about who was the best. Their vision was clouded, and they could not even stop and be grateful for the gift to be so close to our Savior and that they were chosen to be His closest followers.

When we are caught in the raging war of jealousy, fighting, and pride, and begin to become enslaved to our passions we are ultimately being ungrateful for what we have been given. We overlook the blessing God has given us and the gifts and talents He has entrusted to us.

Today, let us recall that we have an infinitely loving God who cares deeply for us. Consider all that He has blessed you with, and how you can use those blessings for His glory.

- Extraordinary Minister The priest is considered the ordinary minister of the Eucharist. The laity participate in this ministry as extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, assisting the priest in the distribution of Holy Communion. This ministry is open to practicing Catholics over the age of 18.
- Lector Lectors serve at Mass by proclaiming the sacred scripture during the Liturgy of the Word, as well as the intercessions.
- Altar Server Altar servers have the privilege of assisting the priest in the sanctuary during the Mass and other liturgical functions. This ministry is open to youth/adults who have made their First Holy Communion.
- Usher Ushers act as ministers of hospitality at Mass, greeting and assisting members of the congregation. They are also responsible for taking up the collection at Mass and distributing bulletins at the conclusion of Mass.



We invite everyone to check out the new art on the north wall of the Parish Hall.

This "Impossible" photo of the Sistine Ceiling Frescoes - and its custom frame - are the work of St Simons Photographer Harlan Hambright, and his master woodcrafter son Hank Hambright.

While enrolled in the University of Tennessee's School of Architecture, Harlan had the opportunity to study for the summer of 1971 in Rome. To celebrate the 50th anniversary of the trip and his work there, Harlan and his wife returned to Italy in 2021.

While in Rome, they visited the Sistine chapel.

The work you see is actually a composite of 3 of the best exposures, one straight up and 2 of angled views toward each end. These three images were combined, correcting the perspective of each image to match a one point perspective looking straight up, and scaling each to match and overlap precisely.

The hand crafted walnut frame was created by Hank Hambright, in his furniture and cabinet shop, and saw mill, Heavy Friends, in Athens, GA.
