

Fer through education, healthcare, water projects and the new Tree Currency Program. Please give generously to the collection after Mass!



STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - OCTOBER 27, 2024



Our Psalm today, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy," sheds light on our glorious Gospel reading about the healing of the blind man, Bartimaeus.

We can learn a lot from Bartimaeus when it comes to our own personal relationships with Jesus. Many of us struggle with something from which we need healing -

physical blindness, illness, addiction, bad habits, anger, sin. In our weakness, do we confidently cry out to Jesus knowing that He will help us?

Oftentimes we begin to, but then a voice in our thoughts tells us to doubt and encourages us to stop trying, like the crowd in our Gospel. Although that voice is persistent and strong, we are called to cry out all the more. If Jesus can hear one voice in a crowd of many, then He can hear our direct prayer to Him in our hearts.

Our Gospel story closes with the miraculous moment when Bartimaeus is healed. The conversation with Jesus was simple. Jesus asked Bartimaeus what he would like Him to do. This man, blind for who knows how many years, desired sight. Jesus responded, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." He was healed and continued to follow Christ.

There was not much that Bartimaeus had to do to become healed. All he needed was his undoubting faith.

Whatever it is that we are struggling with in this life, all Jesus asks of us is to have faith in Him. As a result, we will remain steadfast in our relationship with Christ and will have the strength to keep going. And although we might not be healed in this life, Jesus still hears our confident cries. And through our faith we will surely be healed in the next.

ST. WILLIAM RECTORY RENOVATION CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

We are excited to have kicked off the Capital Campaign for our Rectory Renovation! As you can tell by the pictures be-



low, construction has already begun. When completed in 2025, the residence will be large enough to house our pastor and other clergy that may be assigned to St. William. It will also be able to house retired priest(s) from the Diocese of Savannah. The facility will have three one-bedroom suites plus two additional bedrooms and baths.

To ensure that we had enough support to begin the project, Bishop Parkes allowed us to contact some of our parishioners for help before construction started. Fortunately, we had enthusiastic response, and have commitments in hand for over 50% of the total project costs. We have beginning our formal campaign to raise the additional \$750,000 that will be needed to finish the project.

We ask that you prayerfully consider giving to this capital campaign as an investment to the continued success of St. William. There are many avenues in which to donate to the capital campaign: Cash or




